Many, if not most, of your customers will find it hard to believe that aerosols are environmentally sound products. Often they will need further proof that aerosols are great products! This additional information will help:

Steel is the most recyclable material in the world, and there already exists a large steel can recycling industry. Every can Fuller uses contains 25-100% recycled steel, and aerosol cans, once empty, are easily recycled! To locate the steel recycler nearest you call the Steel Can Recycling Institute at:

There are no ozone depleting freons or chlorofluorocarbons in our aerosols. These propellants were removed years ago, in 1978! Our products contain propane and isobutane which are broken down by sunlight in the lower atmosphere to become carbon dioxide and water. You will

find that the majority of your customers do not know this fact. Be sure to let them know!

Fuller's aerosols are easy to use. What better way is there to get a quick, easy, and even application of product than with the aerosol spray?

Another advantage is that the aerosol package cannot be contaminated after it is manufactured. Any attempt to do so, or accidental damage to the package, will result in a non-usable product.

There is little or no product waste when using aerosols.

That is very easy to understand when you see that the product is applied directly to the job exactly where it is needed.

There is no mixing or left-over mixture to throw away. Since the aerosol can is very well sealed, the remainder of the can will still work when you need it months after you purchase the product.

Many people ask about the shelf-life of aerosols. We recommend using the entire product within two years, though some products will still be usable after as many as eight years on the shelf. When you open your next box of products, remember who the good guys are, and let your customers know why.

PROMOTE ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS.

Besides using mostly citrus-based solvents, many of our "products with a difference" are aerosols. Some people are still under the misconception that aerosols are bad for the environment. Most cities and towns nowadays have a recycling program that will recycle steel aerosol cans. Our plastic bottles are also recyclable. And Fuller's aerosols (since 1978!) have no chlorofluorocarbons that are bad for the ozone layer. An aerosol cleanser can also add an extra concentrated "oomph" for cleaning effectiveness with powerful foaming action to bubble out stains and grease. Aerosols also minimize the amount of cleanser that you need to use for even more value.
